In order to complete the Safety Awards Application, a company must maintain an OSHA #300A Log in accordance with record keeping requirements under the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970.

The National Air Duct Cleaners Association created the NADCA Safety Awards Program to recognize those companies that have sustained superior employee safety and health program results.

*AFTERDISASTER<sup>®</sup>* is one of the few companies in the restoration industry that employs a full-time Safety Manager and Trainer.
